

HOWEVER, our offertory income has fallen off the chart, so please could you consider coming prepared to donate via the static basket just inside the church, or setting up a Standing Order mandate, please? Thanks.



Saturday Vigil Mass: There was a clear mandate for its return. **So it will recommence on Saturday 21st August at 6.30pm. HOWEVER**, for this to happen, we need people willing to disinfect the used pews afterwards. Is there anyone able to do this? Additionally, stewards would be useful. Can you help?

Stewards: Once again, we thank the stewards who have done a great job over the last year. There was a fair mandate to continue with stewards. **So, we will continue with them for Sunday Mass for now. HOWEVER**, we really

need more volunteers for the rota. Age is no longer a barrier!

Singing: After the Vigil Mass, this question had the highest "Yes". **So, as of this Sunday, the Gospel Acclamation, Holy Holy, Mystery of Faith, Great Amen and Lamb of God** (if possible) will be sung. Penitential Act, Gloria, and hymns will come later. If you want to sing, please wear a mask while doing so to prevent the spread of aerosols, the major vector for COVID-19 transmission.



Social distancing, masks, and one-way system: Most of you seem keen to continue as we are, but a fair few are worried about how to do that while increasing numbers. We've rejigged the seating by the fire exit to give a few more seats if we need them. **The whole church remains a socially distanced space.**

Holy Communion: Most of you would like it returned to its usual place. **So, as of today, that is what will happen. HOWEVER**, it will have to be carefully managed as a row-by-row, circulating procession. Since you will be returning to your seat, you won't have to bring all your belongings with you. If you require Holy Communion brought to you, please try to sit on the back row, or other agreed place so that others don't have to leap over you :)



Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion: Most of you were in favour of reinstating this ministry but with a notable number of "No" responses. **So, at the moment, while the Precious Blood is not being offered to the congregation, and numbers are manageable, we will hold off until the Ministry becomes necessary** (which is exactly when the Ministry is intended to be used in Mass).

Public Masses on Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday: 53 of you are in favour. However, we certainly didn't have weekly totals like that before lockdown. Perhaps the Year of the Eucharist is bearing fruits already. **We'll give it a go from October. HOWEVER**, we can't do that without volunteers willing to clean the pews after each Mass and to set-up before Mass. We'll use the main church for all Masses.

Sunday Children's Liturgy: Most of you want to see this return. **HOWEVER**, we'll need so see what the parents/carers think about this first. We can't really do that until school recommences. So, let's see.
