Thought for the week

Jesus set for his followers a three-step procedure for reconciling differences among the community. In the first step we are told to go one-on-one to the person and try to work out the problem. If that doesn't work, we are to take some witnesses, or in the final case, bring the offender before representatives of the Church. If reconciliation does

not occur in the end, there is nothing more we can do and are told to walk away from the person. Reconciling differences can be challenging. How often do we fly off the handle and accuse someone of wrongdoing rather than approach him/her rationally. Jesus tells us that there are other ways besides hostile confrontation to work out

differences. So the next time we feel wronged try to stay calm and think what would Jesus do in this situation ?



NEW TRANSLATION OF THE ROMAN MISSAL

From this, the first weekend in September 2011, parishes throughout England and Wales will start using the new translation of the Missal. This new translation is the biggest change in the way Mass is celebrated since the early 1970s. Everyone should be aware that this is happening; Fr Chris has spoken about the new Translation, we have had inserts in the

newsletter, there is a page on our website also Keith Chappell and Chris Carter spoke at both weekend Masses last weekend. Please use the mass cards which are available from the church porch. Please return them at the end of Mass, they are not to be taken away from the church. The structure of the Mass we celebrate everyday remains the same. The changes are in the priest's words and in

our responses. The Scripture readings are unchanged. It is hoped that this new translation will encourage "a renewal and a deepening of Eucharistic devotion all over the English-speaking world."
